On view at HCCC January 27 - May 4, 2024, the physical iteration of this exhibition will showcase an immersive, experiential installation selected from *Fiber Art Now*'s exhibition-in-print, *Fiber in 3D*, which is dedicated to fiber art that occupies space and explores dimension.
